Public Participation

Mrs. Corzine welcomed all visitors to the meeting and opened the floor for public participation. There was none.

Student Liaison Report

CHS Student Emma Barnes opened her report saying this has been a most difficult year for everyone from the Board to the students. To wrap up the year she interviewed students across the District at all grade levels to get their perspective of the year.

At the Primary School she asked students what their favorite thing was about the school year. Kindergarteners liked eating popsicles, learning to read, field day activities, watching movies, making new friends and learning how to count. First Graders liked learning Math, recess, making new friends and planting a tree in STEM class. The Second Grade students liked Math and Spelling, being able to go to school and walking to the Dairy Queen.

For the older students at the Intermediate School, the Middle School, and the High School, Miss Barnes added three more questions for the students. In addition to their favorite part of the year, she asked them how they would describe the school year; did they think the School District did their best to keep everyone safe within COVID guidelines; and to describe how they felt about the shift from in-person learning to online learning then back to in-person learning. Their favorite things included getting to see their teachers, friends, and actually be there in person. Other favorites were Field Day, PBIS activities, and subjects like Science, Social Studies, and English/Language Arts. CHS students were happy to be participating in sports and that they were able to have a Junior / Senior Prom.

The consensus on the school year was that it was challenging, stressful, hard to get up early and focus on work on the computers all the time. Because of COVID it was crazy, tough, different, challenging and yet good. Everyone across the board felt the School District did everything possible to keep everyone safe. Lastly, as far as how the students felt about shifting to online learning and then back to in-person learning, online learning was more difficult and they enjoyed in-person learning more due to the interaction with teachers and their class mates.

In closing, Miss Barnes said the students had fun and felt safe. On behalf of the students in the District and as the Student Liaison to the Board, she thanked everyone who made this school year possible and for all of the hard work they do for us.

Keys to Success Presentation

CHS Teacher Greg Phillips gave a brief presentation on the Keys to Success Program. This is the Drug Free Program that is unique to Chillicothe City Schools that give students encouragement and support to live life Drug Free. This program was initiated six years ago by alumnus Gary VonKessel to help kids in his home town to change their future. Mr. Phillips is very passionate and excited about the program and its "Power of 1". If you get one student that is willing to say I want to live a drug free life and is willing to take a drug test to prove it, it is worth the effort. Additionally, it is not a punitive program. If a student has a positive drug test, we are there to offer help for the student and family if needed. This program gives students the resources and tools to be able to "Just Say No" to a life of drug use. Then, of course, there are the prizes that are awarded at the end of the year to recognize a successful year, While Covid changed the face of the awards ceremony these past two years, next year we are looking forward to being back in the Hatton Gym for the prize awards for the 21-22 school year. Also, there are plans spread the program into the Middle School and the Intermediate School in the future.

Chillicothe Digital Academy

Sarah Hawthorne, Coordinator of Online Learning and Instruction, updated the Board and Administration with an evaluation of the past year's online program and plans to make things better for the 21-22 school year. Covid opened different opportunities to our students and a lot of our students and families want to continue that option for next year. There has been a great response in the community to our online program with 20 newly open enrolled students and 13 newly enrolled students from within our District who switched from other online instruction academies. The goal for the 21-22 school year is to improve our program with increasing direct online instruction and opportunities for help with a particular class. The online program will also include an engagement connection for participation in athletics, school clubs, and other extra curricular programs.
